

Professor EWA GUZOWSKA – viola



Viola player, pedagogue, habilitated doctor and associate professor at the Karol Szymanowski Academy of Music I.J. Paderewski in Poznań. CEA consultant and expert, Vice-President of the ViolaArte Association, artistic director of the workshops of W. Friemann in Konin and F. Nowowiejski in Poznań. From 2021, the Disciplinary Ombudsman for Students at the Academy of Music in Poznań. From 2022, professor of viola at the International Center for Music and Arts in Beijing. She graduated with distinction from the Universität der Künste in Berlin and with the Summa Cum Laude distinction from postgraduate studies - Masterclass. She is also a graduate with honors from the Academy of Music. I. J. Paderewski in Poznań. He collaborates and gives solo concerts with numerous orchestras. Ewa Guzowska is the winner of numerous awards and distinctions. She won a competition for a scholarship with an internship at the Deutsche Symphonie Orchestra Berlin, she won a competition for a scholarship with an internship at Komische Oper in Berlin and Deutsche Oper Berlin. She received an honorary award from the Mayor of the City of Konin for promoting culture, the Medal of the National Education Commission and the honorary badge Merited for Polish Culture. Several times she received the award of the Rector of the Music Academy in Poznań for outstanding artistic, phonographic and teaching achievements. He runs numerous courses for violists in Poland and abroad. Ewa Guzowska represents Poland at the International Viola Congresses. He is a juror of competitions for violists and chamber music competitions. She has recorded and released albums with Sonatas for viola by J.Brahms, R.Clarke, F.Chopin, P.Hindemith, J.S.Bach, D.Szostakowicz, E.Fabiańska-Jelińska, T.Paciorkiewicz. Many contemporary artists dedicate their works to her. Viola Sonatas, Viola Concertos and duets are written for the artist. Students and graduates of Ewa Guzowska win top places in competitions and work in prestigious orchestras.
